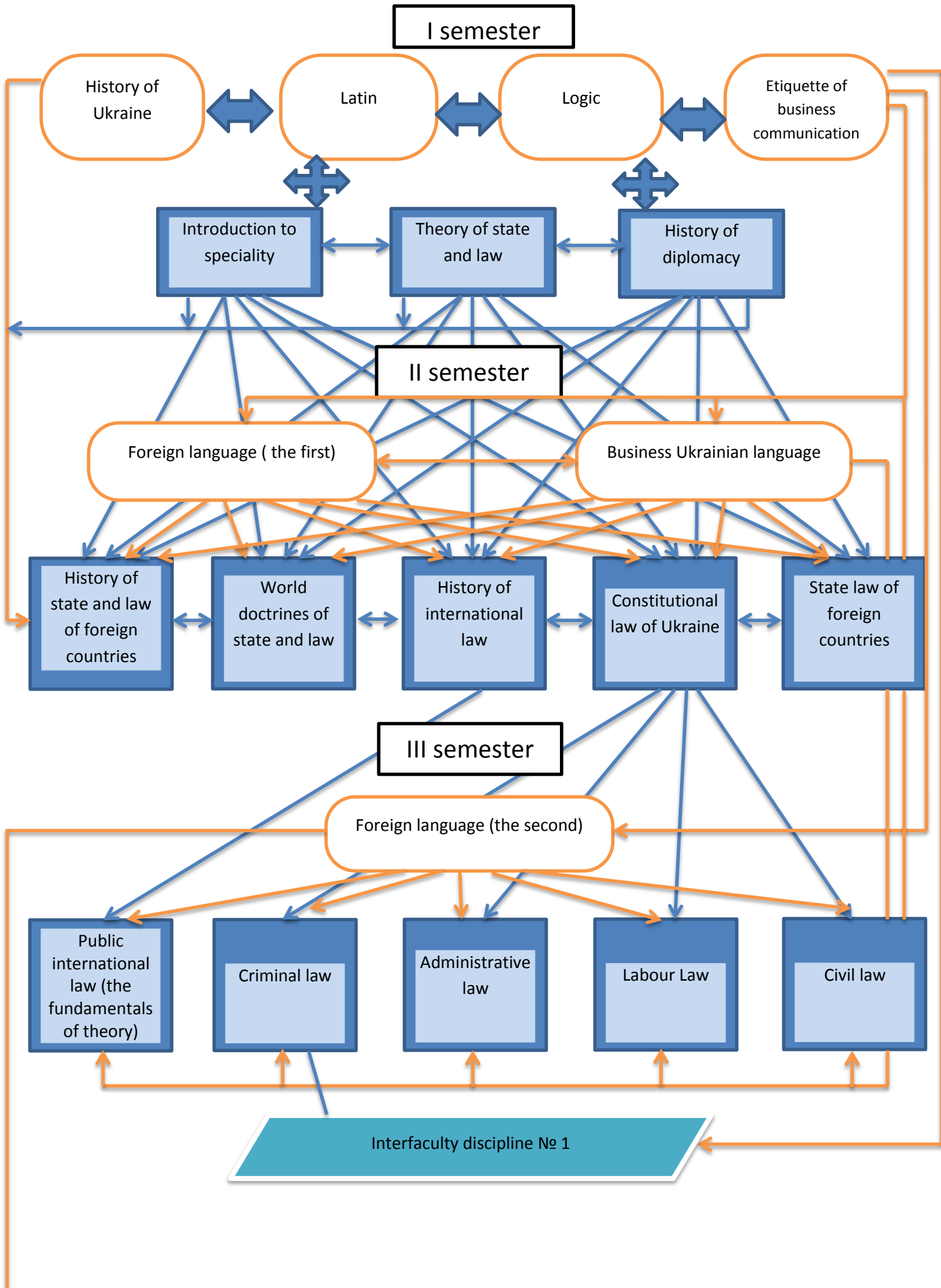

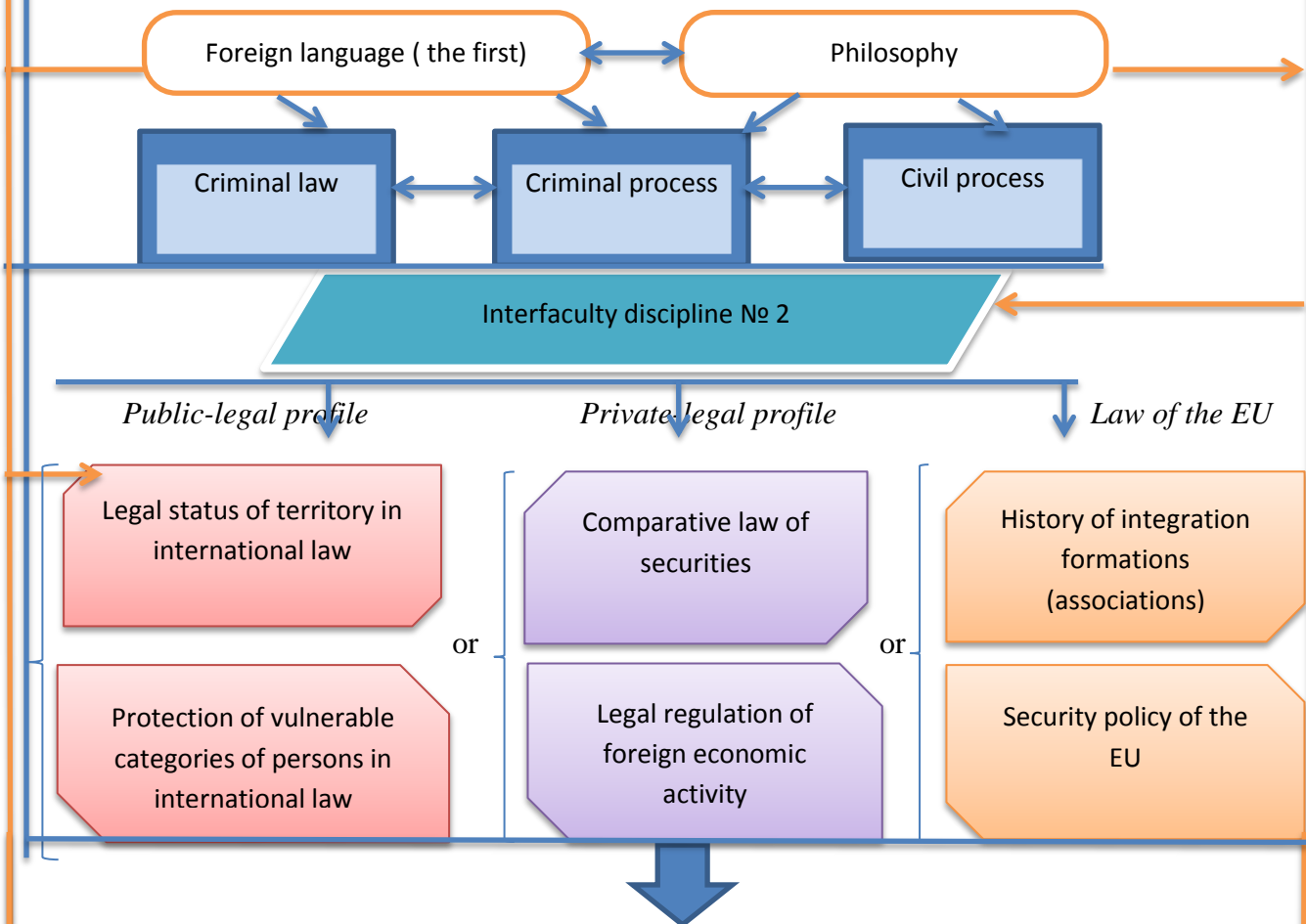

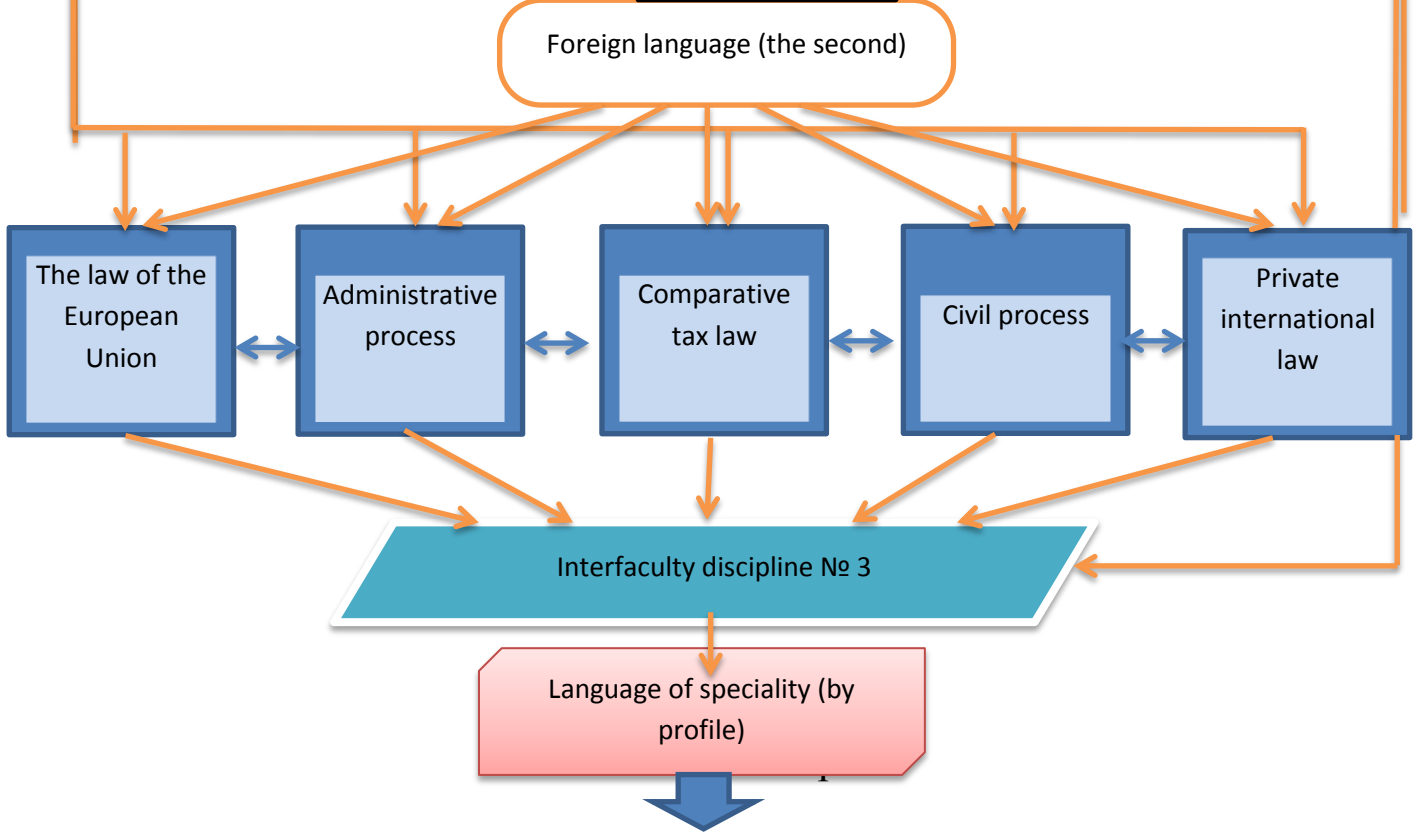
1.1 Structural and logical scheme of EP

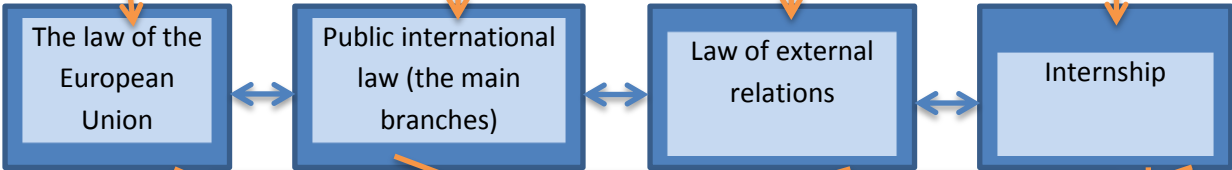

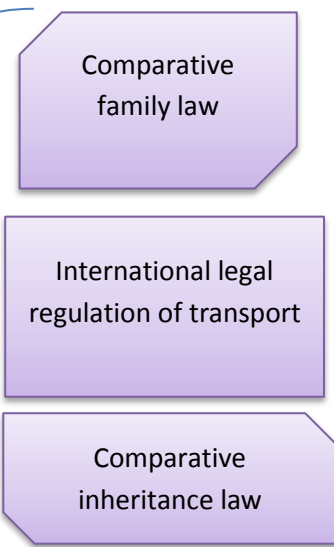

### 3. Form of certification of applicants for higher education.

In order to determine the compliance of the level of knowledge acquisition of graduates to the first (bachelor's) level of higher education, the final certification is carried out in the form of exams: 1. Public international law; 2. Private international law; 3. EU law. Based on the decision of the examination commission, a bachelor's degree is awarded, a state diploma is issued and the qualification "Bachelor of international law" is awarded.
