

GENERAL PROVISIONS

An examination commission is set up at the faculty by order of the rector to certify applicants for higher education, who obtain bachelor's degree. The timing of certification is determined by the curriculum and educational process schedule. Each student passes the certification after full implementation of the relevant curriculum.

Admission to the certification is carried out by order of the rector at the request of the dean of the faculty. The dean of the faculty submits to the rector a request for admission of a student to the certification in the form of a comprehensive examination in case the applicant has fully completed the relevant curriculum.

The procedure for forming, organizing the work and summing up the work of examination commissions is regulated by the Regulations on the procedure for establishing and organizing the work of the Examination Commission for certification of applicants for higher education, who receive bachelor's, master's (bachelor's, specialist's, master's educational and qualification level) degrees.

Certification of applicants for higher education, who obtain bachelor's degree, is carried out in accordance with the requirements of the temporary standard of higher education and educational-professional programme in the form of certification exams.

The main methodological document regulating the content of the certification exam is the programme. It is aimed at providing a comprehensive approach to the assessment of theoretical, methodological and practical training of students, to identify the degree of their preparation for future independent activity.

The purpose of the programme is to determine the amount and required level of theoretical knowledge, practical skills and abilities in specialized disciplines.

To successfully pass the comprehensive examination in the specialty, the student **should know:**

- the essence of EU law through its system components: principles, norms, institutions; basic concepts and terms of European law; evolution, current state, main features and patterns of development of European Union law; the content of regional international legal relations;
- the relationship between European law and EU law, their interaction and interpenetration; the role of EU law in regulating the internal relations of the member states; provisions of international legal documents of the EU and national legislation on further cooperation and prospects for Ukraine's membership in the EU;
- the sources of EU law; rules of interpretation of international legal acts for the purpose of their correct application; international case law (Court of Justice, ECHR);
- the provisions of the main European international legal acts in the field of protection of human rights and freedoms; the importance of the influence of EU law on the formation of a person's worldview; legal and institutional bases of functioning of international and regional (European) mechanisms of protection of human rights and freedoms.

The student should be able to:

- analyse the relations regulated by the norms of European law, including international interstate relations and international non-state relations; interpret international agreements;
- analyse the current legislation of Ukraine for compliance with its international obligations according to the texts of the EU founding treaties and international agreements; analyse international legal phenomena: whether they took place, what they are today and what they may become in accordance with current trends; consider the latter in the relationship and interaction with other international legal phenomena;
- work with regional international legal acts governing the activities of international institutions for the protection of human rights and the materials of the practice of these institutions;
- interpret international agreements; analyse the current legislation of the EU member states guided by the texts of international agreements.

Form of certification exam and evaluation criteria:

Examination tasks are given to applicants in test form, one exam paper contains 100 questions (each correct answer is estimated at 1 point) and each offers four possible answers, where only one is correct.

Evaluation criteria:

The score for the exam is made by calculating the amount of correct answers and is determined by a four-level scale:

Excellent – from 90 to 100 points;

Good – from 70 to 89 points;

Satisfactory – from 50 to 69 points;

Unsatisfactory – less than 50 points.

TOPIC 1. PREREQUISITES FOR EUROPEAN INTEGRATION

Historical prerequisites for the integration process in Europe and the world. Political and cultural preconditions for the creation of the EU. European idea: concept, meaning, evolution. Concepts of creating a political union in Europe in the Middle Ages and modern times. United States of Europe. The Marshall Plan and the Organization for European Economic Cooperation. Council of Europe. NATO.

The main stages of the formation of the European Communities and the European Union. Schuman Plan of 1950. 'Community method' and its difference from the method of intergovernmental cooperation. Establishment and development of the European Communities: the European Coal and Steel Community, the European Economic Community and the European Atomic Energy Community. Maastricht Treaty of 1992. Transformation of the European Economic Community into the European Community.

TOPIC 2. THE EUROPEAN UNION – A NEW ORGANIZATION OF POLITICAL AUTHORITY IN EUROPE

European Union: composition, territory, population. Member States of the European Union. Territorial sphere of EU's activity. Features of the legal regime of "overseas countries and territories". The EU citizenship and its significance. Official languages of the EU. Symbols of the European Union (anthem, flag, etc.).

European Union and Council of Europe. Common tasks and similarities in the development of the European Union and the Council of Europe. Methods and forms of integration within the two associations. Interaction between the European Union and the Council of Europe at the present stage.

The European Union at the present stage. Problems of EU enlargement at the present stage, the procedure for accepting new members. Plans for further reforms of the European Union. Federalization as the main direction of political and legal integration within the European Union.

TOPIC 3. GOALS AND PRINCIPLES OF ACTIVITY OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The concept and classification of the EU's objectives. General and specific objectives of the European Union. Principles of the European Union: system and content. Additional competence of the European Union. The main directions and legal forms of expanding the competence of the European Union. Inherent powers of the European Union, the procedure for their implementation. Principles and mechanism of enhanced cooperation.

TOPIC 4. LEGAL NATURE AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION LAW

Legal nature of European Union law, the history of its development. Definition of European Union law. Correlation between the concepts of 'European law' and 'European Union law'. EU law as a branch of law.

European Union law as a science. Definition of the science of European Union law and its development at the present stage. The role of general theoretical, historical and branch legal sciences in the study of EU law. Basic scientific schools of European law.

European Union law as a discipline. Definition and general characteristics of European Union law as a discipline. Subject and system of the course. Sources and methods of knowledge of European Union law. Correlation of the course 'European Union Law' with other disciplines (history of state and law, constitutional law of foreign states, public international law, private international law, comparative law and others).

TOPIC 5. LEGAL SYSTEM OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The system of law of the European Union: the main ways of construction. Subject, functional and structural approaches. Branches and institutions of law of the European Union. 'Institutional' and 'substantive' law of the European Union. Structural components of European Union law. The concept of 'community law'. The place of community law in the legal system of the European Union.

TOPIC 6. PRINCIPLES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION LAW

Principles of European Union law: concept, classification. General and functional principles. General principles of law. The principle of protection of individual rights and freedoms. The principle of legal certainty. The principle of proportionality. The principle of non-discrimination. The principle of subsidiarity. Functional principles. The principle of the rule of EU law. The principle of direct effect of EU law. Sources and method of enshrining the principles of European Union law. The role of supranational judicial bodies in the development, recognition and protection of basic principles of EU law.

TOPIC 7. SOURCES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION LAW

Sources of EU law: concepts, classification of sources of EU law. Primary legislation. Theory of separation of primary and derivative (secondary) European law (European Union legislation). Sources of primary law, their classification. Derived (secondary) legislation. General characteristics of secondary legislation. Direct and indirect application of secondary law. Classification of acts of secondary legislation. Court decisions. The role of judicial precedent as a source of EU law.

Correlation between norms of EU law and norms of public international law. Treaties concluded by the European Union. Treaties concluded by EU member states. EU law and national law. National law as a source of EU law. The rule of EU law and the doctrine of direct effect.

TOPIC 8. COMPETENCE OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The concept of competence of the European Union. Competence of the European Union: structure and content. Legal sources of competence of the European Union. Division of competences of the European Union between the common foreign and security policy, and the cooperation of the police and the judiciary in the field of criminal law. The nature of the competence of the European Union. Delimitation of competences and powers between the European Union and the Member States. Exclusive competence of the EU.

EU competence. Scope of competence and activity of the EU. EU common market. Economic and monetary union. Legislative, executive-administrative, jurisdictional and other powers of the EU, legal forms of their implementation. International legal personality and international agreements of the EU.

TOPIC 9. COMPETENCE OF THE EUROPEAN UNION IN THE FIELD OF COMMON FOREIGN AND SECURITY POLICY

Historical aspects of the formation and development of the legal framework for common foreign and security policy. Subject, goals and principles of the common foreign and security policy. Security policy bodies. Powers of the European Union in matters of common foreign and security policy and forms of their implementation. International agreements of the European Union in the field of common foreign and security policy.

Legal bases of the common defence policy of the European Union. Rapid response forces.

TOPIC 10. BODIES AND INSTITUTIONS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Organizational mechanism of the European Community and the European Union. The concept of 'institute' and 'body' in the law of the European Union. The system of EU institutions. Classification of EU bodies. The system of EU institutional bodies.

European Parliament. Composition, functions, rules of procedure, place in the system of supranational bodies of the EU, sphere of competence. Procedure for election and legal status of members of the European Parliament. Legal and political responsibility of the European Parliament and its members. Deputy immunity.

European Council. Composition, procedure for forming and holding meetings. Powers. Decisions of the European Council. Special powers of the European Council. European Council and Council of the European Union.

Council of the European Union. Place in the system of EU bodies. Composition and order of formation. Scope and content of powers. Procedure and decision-making procedure. Responsibility of the Council of the EU.

European Commission. The supranational nature of the EU Commission. Composition, functions, responsibilities, powers. External functions of the EU Commission. The Commission's rights vis-à-vis EU Member States. Delegation of

additional powers to the EU Commission. Political responsibility of the EU Commission.

Financial institutions. The system of EU financial institutions, legal regulation and control over their activities. European Investment Bank: legal status, main activities, governing bodies. Legal status of EU structural funds.

Advisory bodies. Features of the legal status of advisory bodies, main and auxiliary advisory bodies. Legal status of the Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions.

Legislative procedures in the European Union. Legislative process. Budget process. Separation of powers.

TOPIC 11. JUDICIAL SYSTEM OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The judicial system of the European Union: general principles of construction. The main branches of the judicial system of the Union. The Court of Justice of the European Union: composition and procedure. Features of the status of Advocates General. Guarantees of independence of members of the Court. Plenum and Chambers of the Court. Organization of work and decision-making procedure. Jurisdiction of the Court.

Legal status, composition, competence of the Tribunal. Procedure of the Tribunal.

Legal status of specialized tribunals. The procedure for creating and giving them jurisdictional powers.

TOPIC 12. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND INTERNAL LEGISLATION OF THE MEMBER STATES

The doctrine of the supremacy of European Union law over the national law of the Member States. The doctrine of the direct effect of European Union law. Direct effect of the founding treaties of the European Union. Direct effect of international agreements. Direct effect of regulations. Direct effect of directives and decisions.

TOPIC 13. RESPONSIBILITY IN THE LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Liability of Member States to individuals for breaches of European Union law. The principle of Member States' responsibility for non-implementation of directives. The principle of liability of Member States for infringements of European Union law. Responsibility of the European Union. Judicial review of acts of the institutions of the European Union.

TOPIC 14. FUNDAMENTALS OF THE LEGAL STATUS OF HUMANS AND CITIZENS IN THE EUROPEAN UNION

Citizenship of the European Union. Sources of legal regulation of the legal status of human and citizen in the EU. Citizenship of the EU and citizenship of the Member States. Grounds for acquiring and terminating EU citizenship.

Fundamental rights, freedoms and responsibilities of human and citizen in the EU. Principles of legal status of a person in the EU and ways to consolidate

them. Classification of human and citizen's rights. Possible restrictions on the exercise of fundamental rights and freedoms, their limits. The main responsibilities of a citizen.

Guarantees of human and citizen's rights and freedoms. Classification of guarantees of human and citizen's rights and freedoms. Institutional guarantees. Judicial protection of rights and freedoms. Extrajudicial mechanisms for the protection of rights and freedoms. Procedural guarantees. Material guarantees of human and citizen's rights and freedoms.

The Ombudsman of the European Union: the procedure for election, powers, the procedure for applying to the Ombudsman.

SECTION 2. MAIN BRANCHES AND FIELDS OF REGULATION IN THE EUROPEAN UNION LAW

TOPIC 15. INTERNAL MARKET LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Free movement of goods in the EU. The internal market as the goal of the EU. Fiscal measures. Customs union. Prohibition of customs duties on imports and exports to the EU and all duties having equivalent effect. Prohibition of discriminatory taxation. Non-fiscal revenues. Freedom to provide and receive services in the EU. The concept of 'service' in EU law. Transport nature of services in EU law. Freedom to receive services in the EU and to determine the qualifications of service providers.

Freedom of capital movement in the EU. The concept of capital and capital movements. The principle of freedom of movement of capital. Exceptions to the principle of free movement of capital and their application. Features of regulation of financial services and credit institutions.

TOPIC 16. COMPANY LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Company law. Legal regulation of legal entities. Concepts, sources of company law. The main methods of regulating the activities of legal entities: harmonization and unification. Establishment and operation of companies. Reorganization of companies. Legal entities of supranational character.

TOPIC 17. COMPETITION LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

EU competition law. Concepts, goals and objectives of competition policy. EU competition rules, subjects of competition rules. Concepts, functions of legal regulation in the field of EU competition policy. Regulation of agreements between business entities. Regulating the activities of business entities that

dominate the EU internal market. Control over the concentration of business entities in the EU internal market.

TOPIC 18. REGULATION OF CIVIL AND LEGAL RELATIONS IN THE LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Contracts law. The nature and current trends in the regulation of civil property relations in the EU. Certain types of contracts and binding rights arising from them. The law applicable to contractual and non-contractual obligations. General legal issues of consumer protection in the EU. Legal regulation of relations with the participation of the consumer.

TOPIC 19. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

EU intellectual property law. Harmonization of intellectual property rights in the EU. Legal protection of intellectual property. Inventions. Industrial property. Trademarks. Copyright regulation. Intellectual property protection. The principle of free movement of goods and intellectual property rights in the EU.

TOPIC 20. LEGAL BASIS OF THE ECONOMIC SYSTEM OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Legal bases of economic and monetary union. Stages of creating an economic and monetary union. Economic and monetary union: the concept and economic content. Economic Committee. The European system of central banks: functions and powers. Legal status of the European Central Bank. Legal regulation of banking activities. Introduction of the single European currency (euro).

TOPIC 21. BANKING LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

EU banking law. The concept of EU banking law. EU banking system, its structure. EU banking and banking legislation. Basic principles of legal regulation of EU banking. The main institutions of EU banking law.

TOPIC 22. TAX LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The concept of EU tax law and tax policy. Sources of EU tax law. The ratio of supranational and national levels in EU tax law. The main types of EU taxes. Agricultural taxes. Toll. VAT. Excise duty. Transport taxation. Capital tax and securities transactions. Taxation of companies. Transfer pricing. Income Tax of Individuals. Avoidance of double taxation.

TOPIC 23. CUSTOMS LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

EU customs law. Concepts, sources of EU customs law. The concept and history of the creation of the EU customs union. Customs union. Customs territory. Basic principles of tariff and non-tariff regulation. Unified customs tariff. Determining the country of origin of goods. Determination of customs value. Customs procedures. Cooperation between the customs administrations of the Member States.

TOPIC 24. TRADE LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Concepts, features of EU trade law. Export regulation. Tariff regulation of imports. Regime of generalized tariff preferences. Non-tariff regulation of imports. Anti-dumping measures. Anti-subsidy measures. Measures against harmful imports and 'growing' imports. Measures on trade barriers. Regulation of quantitative restrictions.

TOPIC 25. AGRICULTURAL LAW OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

The EU's common agricultural policy and agricultural law. Stages of formation of the common agricultural policy of the EU. EU powers in the field of agriculture. Mechanisms for environmental protection and environmental rights of citizens in the EU.
