3. Form of certification of applicants for higher education.

In order to determine the conformity of the level of knowledge acquisition of graduates to the second educational (master's) level, a final certification is conducted, which provides:

Comprehensive certification exam, the programme of which consists of the following disciplines: International legal principles of human rights activities, International labour law; Foreign language (English).

Exam commissions evaluate students who graduate from a higher education institution on the basis of a qualifying exam, the tasks of which include questions that allow to assess the general preparation of the graduate and the quality of solving professional tasks by the graduate.

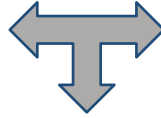
The higher education degree applicant is awarded the qualification of master of international law by the decision of the exam commissions; a diploma of the established standard form is issued.

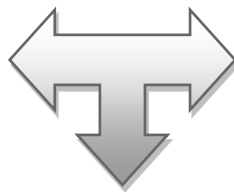
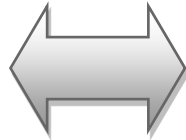
