The study discipline «Law of the EU Internal Market» program is compiled by the educational-professional (educational-scientific) bachelor's training program with the speciality 293 International Law.

1. Description of the academic discipline

- 1.1. The purpose of teaching the academic discipline is to train specialists who have high legal awareness and legal culture, possess the knowledge and practical skills necessary for their professional activities to solve specific tasks in the field of family law; and are capable of independently and competently navigating modern family legal relations, making balanced and well-founded decisions within the framework of their professional competence.

7. Teaching methods

Three groups of teaching methods are used:

- 1. verbal descriptive disclosure of educational material, explanation of the essence of the relevant phenomenon, concept, process, instruction on the specifics of the application of certain norms, checking the level of the independent processing of educational material, etc.;
 - 2. Visual demonstration of diagrams, tables, and drawings (if available);
- 3. Practical formation of skills and abilities to operate with legal categories, apply legal norms and use the acquired knowledge in conducting seminars.

8. Control methods

Control methods are methods of diagnostic activity that allow for feedback in the learning process in order to obtain data on the success of learning and the effectiveness of the learning process.

Control measures determine the compliance of the level of knowledge, skills and abilities acquired by students with the requirements of normative documents on higher education.

Entrance control is used to find out the level of students' knowledge of the subjects that are basic for studying this subject. It is held on the beginning of studying the discipline through an oral survey or express control (testing).

Current control is carried out at each seminar class in the form of an oral survey, student presentations, writing and defense of abstracts, control papers.

The current control is carried out in the form of a written test for the purpose of evaluating the knowledge and skills acquired during the study of the topics of the corresponding section. Written test work may involve detailed answers to questions, answers to tests.

At the end of the course, an exam is held in the form of a written exam paper . Written examination work may involve detailed answers to questions, answers to tests.

A student is allowed to take the semester final examination if he or she has scored at least 10 points. The maximum number of points that a student can score in the final examination is 40. The maximum amount of points that a student can score in a discipline is 100.

For practical scientific work (writing a research paper, abstracts, participation in scientific and practical conferences, participation in a club, etc.) in the field of this discipline, by the decision of the department by the criteria established by the program of the domain, a student may receive up to 10 additional (incentive) points, but within the maximum total amount of points - 100.

Answer in the seminar class - 1-5 points.

Criteria for evaluating an oral response

Ongoing control is carried out, particularly through a survey and review of the results of seminar and practical classes on a five-point grading scale.

5 points are awarded under the following conditions:

- the student is actively working throughout the practical training;
- gives a complete, correct, consistent, coherent, well-founded presentation of the issue, accompanied by proper examples from doctrinal sources and references to current legislation;
- everything that is presented should indicate a deep understanding and orientation in the phenomena and processes under study;
 - correct and comprehensive answers to additional questions from the teacher.

4 points:

- the student actively works during the practical lesson;
- gives a correct, complete summary of the textbook content and material presented by the teacher but answers additional control questions posed by the teacher to determine the depth of understanding and ability to navigate phenomena and processes only with some help from the teacher or colleagues;
 - insufficiently comprehensive answers to additional questions posed by the teacher.

3 points

- the student behaves passively in class responds only when called by the teacher;
- generally demonstrates knowledge of the primary educational material under consideration but makes mistakes during the answer and realizes them only after the teacher's instruction;
- answers to questions not immediately but only after some memory strain, and the answers are unclear;
- is unable to draw correlations with other problems of the discipline being studied without the teacher's help;

2 points:

- makes significant mistakes or skips the material altogether and partially corrects these mistakes only after the instructor's instructions;
- the student shows ignorance of a significant part of the educational material, presents it illogically and uncertainly, there are pauses and interruptions in the answer, and cannot explain the problem, although they understand it;
 - the material is not sufficiently coherent and consistent.

1 points:

- the student makes gross mistakes in the presentation of the material and does not correct these mistakes even when pointed out by the teacher;
- demonstrates a lack of understanding of the material and, as a result, a complete lack of skills in analyzing phenomena and in the subsequent performance of practical tasks.

Evaluation criteria for tests and examinations/certificates

Control and examination (test) papers are performed in writing. A control paper consists of

20 test tasks, and an examination/scoring paper consists of 40 test tasks. Each test task has five answer options, only one of which is correct; one point is awarded for each correct answer.

The maximum number of points that a student can receive based on the results of each of the practical classes is 10 points, regardless of the form of its implementation.

Criteria for evaluating the level of success in a seminar session

«Excellent» - all points related to a theoretical or an answer to a practical Questions are highlighted at a high level, fully disclosed, and, if necessary, confirmed by legal norms.

«Good» - not all points regarding the theoretical or the answer to the practical question are disclosed or not fully informed and covered at the average level.

«Satisfactorily» - the points regarding the theoretical or the answer to the practical question are Disclosed and covered at a low level, or the main ones are not covered.

«Unsatisfactory» - the student made a gross mistake when answering a The theoretical or practical question, in particular, did not reveal at least one central aspect of the given question or was utterly unable to demonstrate an answer to it.

The assessment of disciplines, the form of final control of which is credit, is based on the Results of the assessment of current activity are expressed on a two-point scale: «passed» or «not passed». To enrol, a student must receive a score of at least 60% of the maximum points for the module for the current educational activity (for a 100-point scale - at least 60 points).
